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75th INDEPENDENCE DAY SPEECH

Good morning to everyone,

August 15 is an unforgettable day in the history of India. Independence Day of the Indian subcontinent after a long struggle. The Smart Room with all facilities was established for IQAC, which is the main team working for NAAC accreditation.

27 cameras are installed on the college campus to prevent unwanted activity. Now our college is under CCTV surveillance.

Nearly 100 seminars have been organized in the recent past. Professors from various colleges and universities were invited to speak on various topics.

The state level cricket tournament was conducted by our college for the first time in the history of our college. Nearly 14 colleges came forward to play in the tournament.

There is a Ganesha temple on our college campus. The consecration took place. Before that, the temple was painted in many colors.

Renovations were carried out in several places using paints. Library, Department of Economics and Memorial of Thiru. P. K. MookiyaThevar.

The PKM Youth Development Trust donated a smart TV to our college to facilitate online meetings.

Our college has a Memorandum of Understanding with the PKM Youth Development Trust.

A parent-teacher-student joint meeting was organized at the college. But there was a lukewarm attendance from the parent side.

To decentralize executive powers, several new positions were created. Namely, Vice-Principal, Controller of Examinations, Dean, Director for Disciplinary Affairs, Administrative Officer, Executive Officer and Estate Officer.

Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose's 125th birthday was celebrated.

We celebrated the following celebrations with great joy in our college. Diwali, Christmas, New year, Pongal, International women's day.

A statue of Mother Nature was erected on the college campus by the Nature Conservation Club. We are proud that this is the first statue in the world. Our college has a memorandum of understanding with the Nature Conservation Club.

The day after Mahasivarathri, students of the Nature Conservation Club were engaged in removing plastic items at Andipatti Velappar temple.

Spoken English classes were organized for our college teaching staff. Of them, 15 teachers were selected on the basis of merit and skill. They have been appointed as teachers in the newly opened department called the Department of Spoken English.

Guinness World Record holder Mr. Ganesan was accorded a warm welcome at our college. It is noteworthy that he is an alumnus of our college.

A legal awareness program was organized at our college. At the event, three judges from Usilampatti spoke about the importance of awareness.

Road Safety Month was observed. A rally was organized by our NSS units. Our NSS students participated in the rally.

The rally was organized by our NSS units in collaboration with the Usilampatti Police Department to create awareness among the voters during the Assembly elections.

Our college has been transformed into a somewhat computerized administration. Our college has a Memorandum of Understanding with a group at Madurai.
